> 'SAX TALK' Norman Salant (C.D. Presents Ltd.)

Norman Salant is an artist exploring the possibilities of the saxophone as a lead instrument in a genre other than jazz.

". What that genre is, is anybody's guess. The seven cuts on "Sax Talk" work their way through funk, dance, new-wave, electronic freak and Third World influences.

Playing over basic guitar-drum-basssynth back-ups, Salant covers a variety of textures and styles, from the squawking jazz imitation of the title cut, to the blackvelvet smoothness of "Europe After Dark," to the sinuous Middle Eastern snakecharmer melody of "No Night."

Strange stuff, meticulously composed and faultlessly, played. But Salant exhibits a slowness about getting to the point — perhaps a lack of point in the first place — that makes the LP difficult and sometimes tedious going.

Patient listeners who like to stay out of the mainstream will find it rewarding.
